

RESOLUTION PPG-BAIP 002, of March 30th, 2011

Establishes the norms and criteria that are to be observed in the writing of the dissertations' and the theses' texts as well as in the projects for the admission into the program, to be presented to the Postgraduate Program in the Biology of Infectious and Parasitic Agents.

The Collegiate Body of the Postgraduate Program in the Biology of Infectious and Parasitic Agents, in exercise of its legal requirements conferred by article 11 of the statute of the postgraduate program in Biology of Infectious and Parasitic Agents, approved in a meeting of the Collegiate Body on September 29th of 2009 and in accordance with Resolution No. 3.359 (July 14th, 2005) of the General Bylaws of the Strictu Sensu postgraduate courses of the UFPA, and in accordance with Resolution No. 3.870 (July 1st, 2009) of the CONSEPE-UFPA, decides the following:

Art. 1. Dissertations and theses must be presented in accordance with the technical norms approved by the Collegiate Body of the Postgraduate Program in the Biology of Infectious and Parasitic Agents, present in Appendix I, of this resolution.

Sole Paragraph. Dissertations and theses must be typed out in the Portuguese language, and contain a summary both in the Portuguese language and in the English language.

Art 2. The dissertation and the thesis may be presented to the examining board in the traditional method or in the method that concerns the aggregation of scientific articles.

§ 1°. The traditional method follows a classic structure, portrayed in Appendix I.

§ 2°. As long as most of the project's goals are reached in a timely manner, the student may choose to carry out a presentation in the method that concerns the aggregation of scientific articles, where the document must contain an integrative text and whole articles, ranging in number from 1 (one) or more for the Master's and 3 (three) or more for the Doctoral, and published or accepted in specialized journals with an editorial staff. At least one of the articles must present the student as the main author.

§ 3°. Documentation evidencing the acceptance of the article by the journal's editorial board will be required; a copy of the document must be placed with the dissertation or thesis as an APPENDIX.

Art. 3°. For the final editing of the dissertation or thesis the student must provide at least 1 (one) copy of the work to the program's Coordinating Body, 1 (one) copy to PROPESP, who will in turn be responsible for creating a registration and will then pass it on to UFPA's Central Library and to the national register, as well as 2 (two) copies for the concerned departmental library linked to the program, and 1 (one) electronic copy for each member of the examining board.

Sole paragraph. The dissertation or thesis must also be handed in an electronic version at the program's secretariat.

Art. 4°. In order to present a qualification Project and a project requesting enrollment, the student must abide by the norms set down under item 3.1 of appendix of this resolution.

5°. The cases which have been omitted must be decided by the program's Collegiate body.

Art. 6°. This resolution comes into force on the date of its approval/publication.
